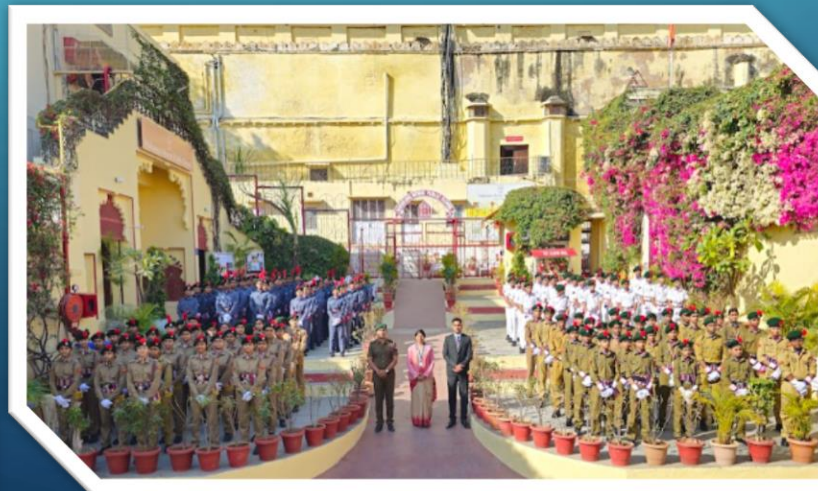




## NCC CADETS COMMEMORATE THE 78TH ARMY DAY

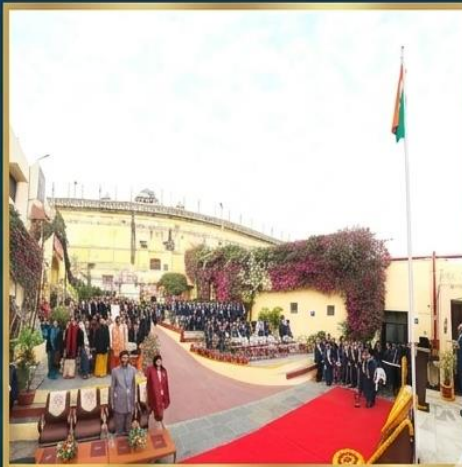
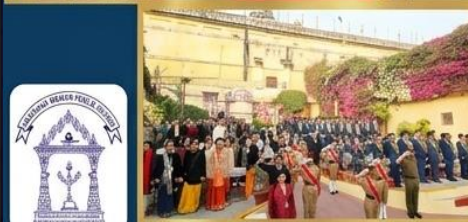

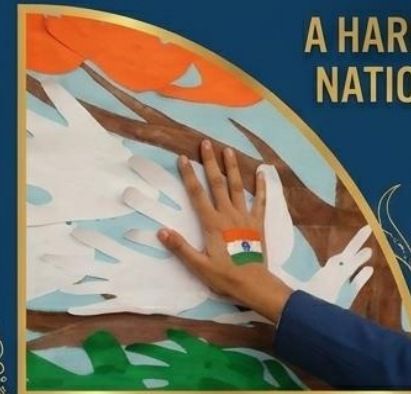
